**Humanist:** a person who seeks natural explanations to answer life's big questions and for events in the world around them

**Belief:** trust or confidence in something

**Moral:** acting in the correct way

**Golden Rule:** to treat other people as you want to be treated

**Humanism:** a non-religious worldview of life and the world

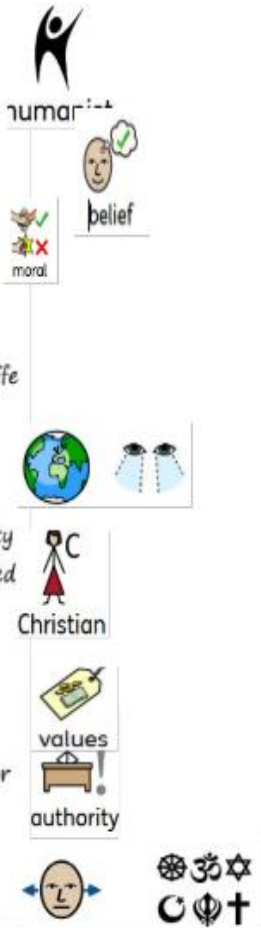
**Worldview:** a person's view of the world

**Christian:** a person who follows Christianity and believes Jesus is the Saviour who healed the rift between humanity and God.

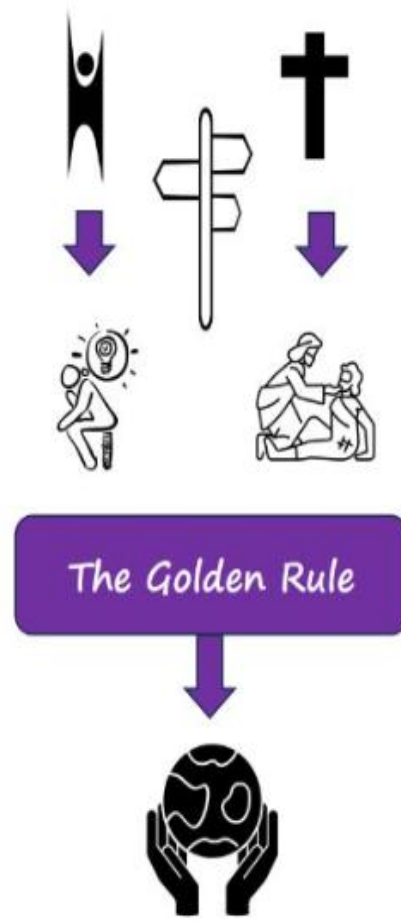
**Values:** something that is important in terms of what you believe or how you act

## So how does it all work?



Thinking about religion and belief: I can understand that there are many different religious and non-religious belief systems with moral codes.

Practices and lifestyles (what people do): I can understand that humanists believe that people do not have to follow a religion such as Christianity to be moral but should be free to work out what makes them happy.

Meaning and purpose (making sense of life): I can make informed responses to other's beliefs and understand that the 'golden rule' can be a moral code for both religious (eg Christian) and humanist people.
